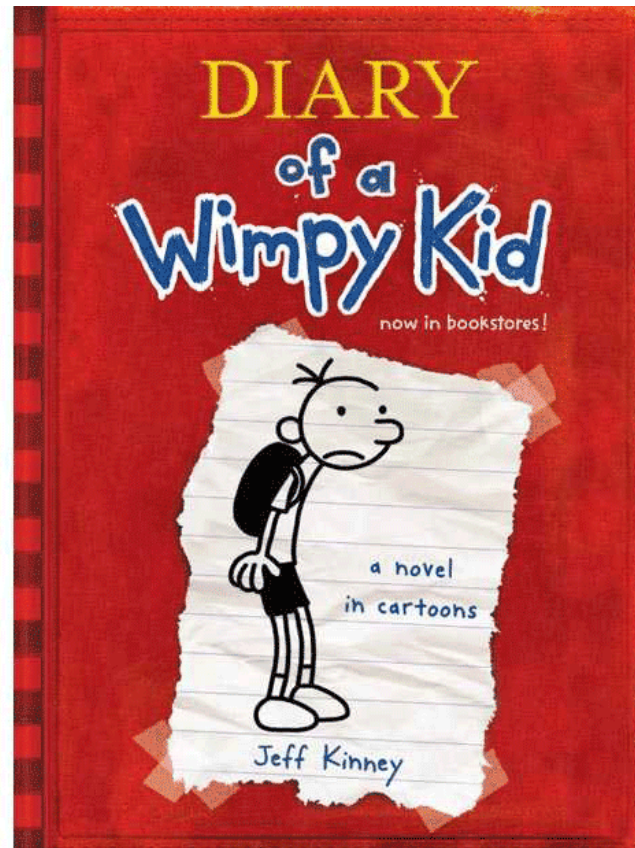


Diary of a Wimpy Kid: Level 2

My name is Greg. This is my journal. Today was my first day back at middle school.

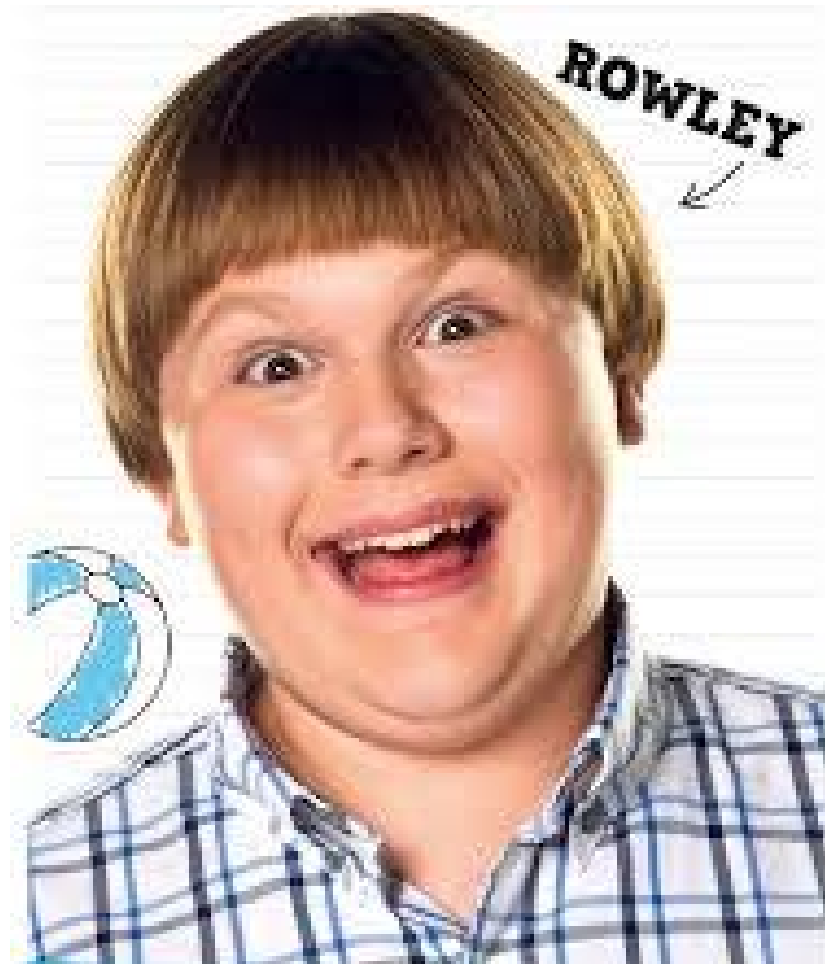


At school today, I went to see if the moldy cheese was still on the playground. Someone left it there last year. It was gross! If you touch the cheese, you have the Cheese Touch.

I had a lot of adventures in middle school.

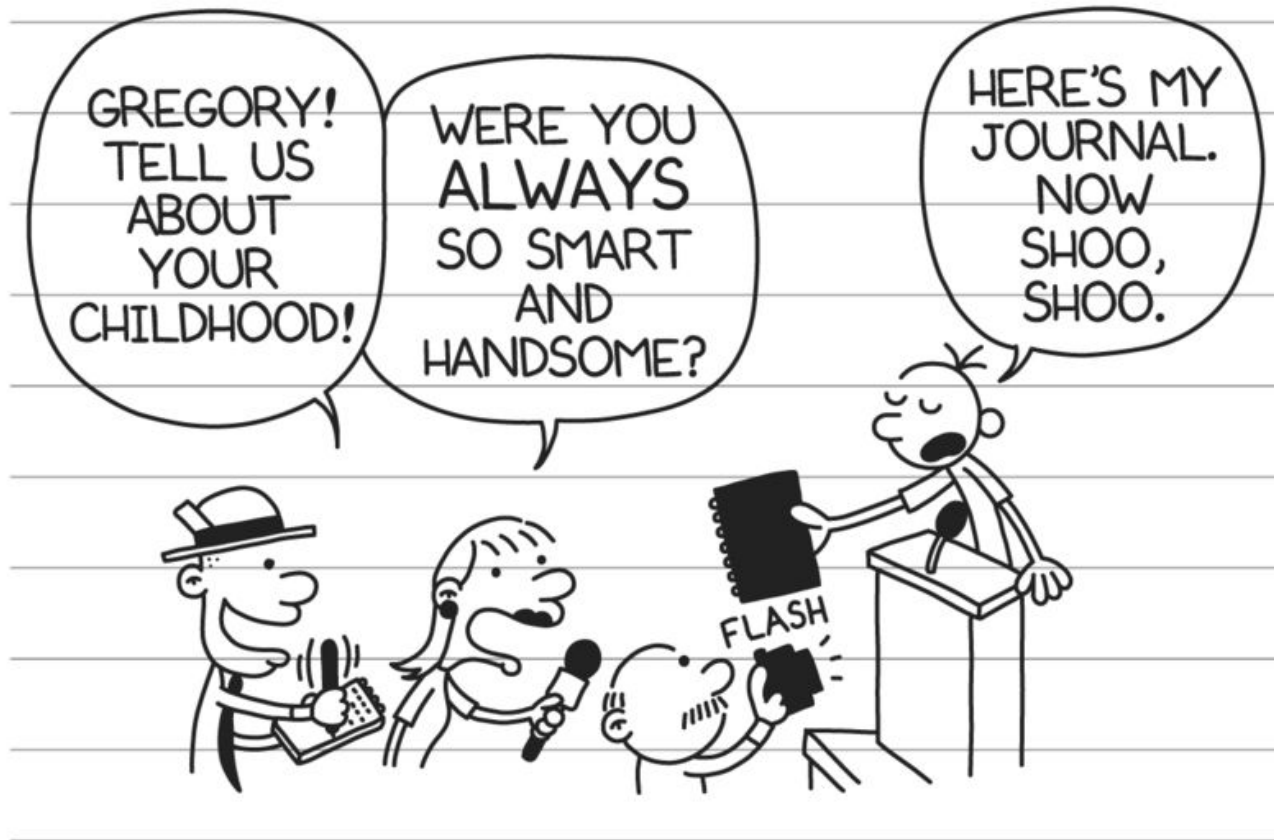


Trouble (p. 24-43)

I go to my best friend Rowley's house to play video games. I always beat him at racing video games.

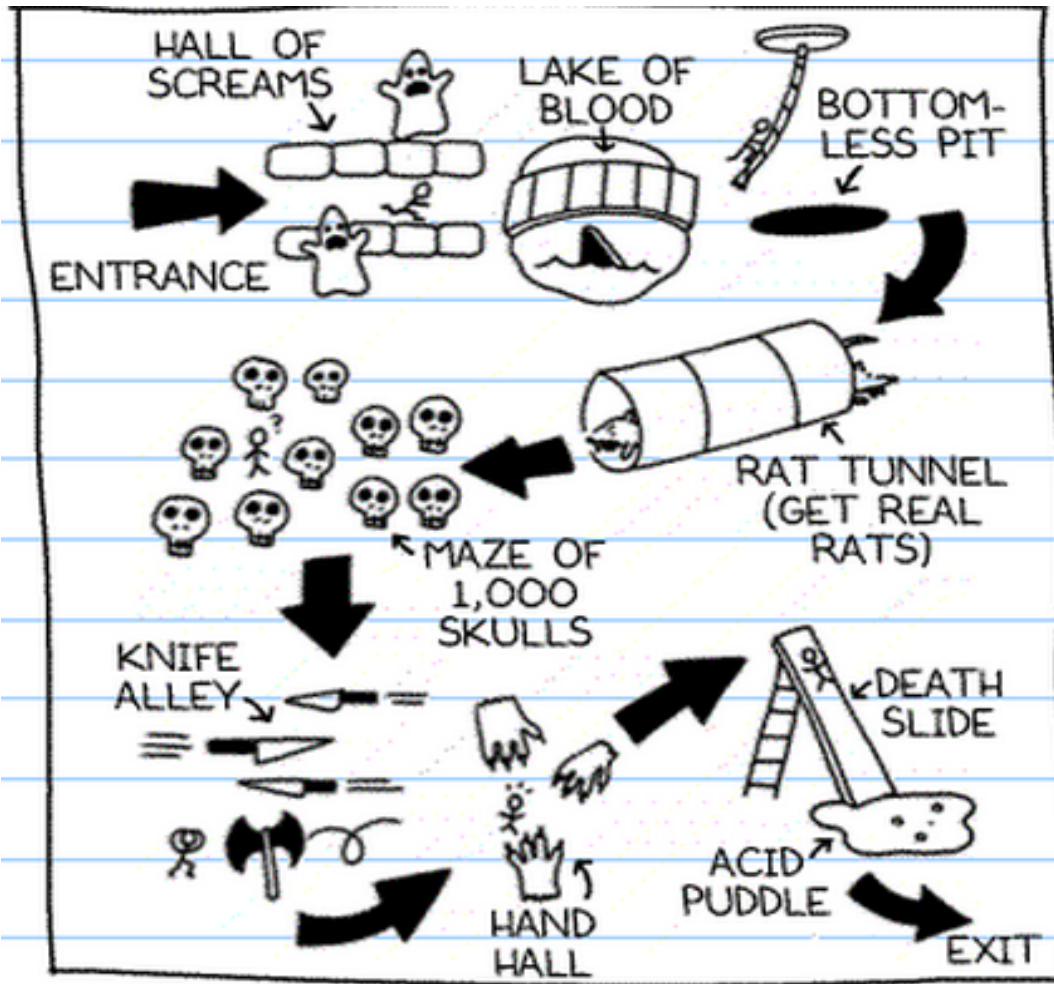


Rodrick got a new CD. My parents said I'm not allowed to listen to it.

Big Wheel Game (p. 136-144)

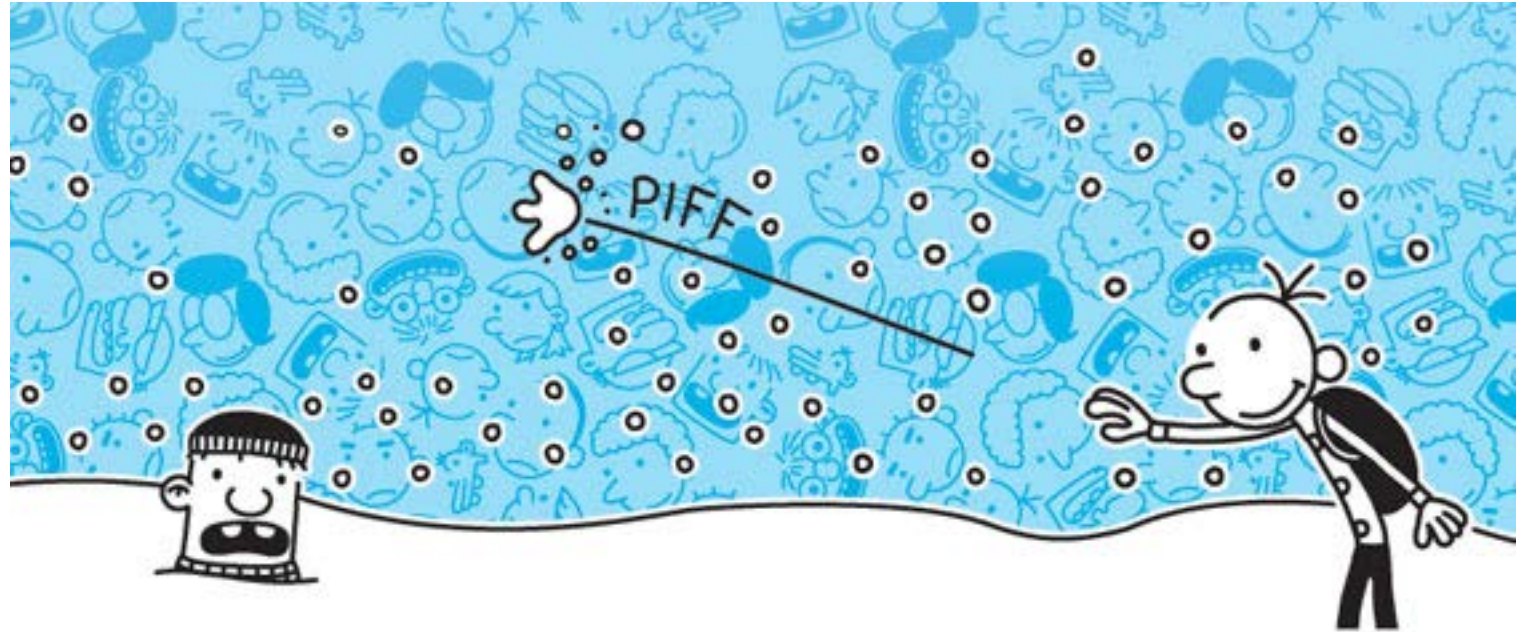
