

Feelings and behavior

At this age, your **Child** is exploring and learning to express his emotions. He'll do this in many ways – for example, by talking, using gestures and noises, painting and making things. Thinking


Your preschooler will understand more about opposites – for example, high/low – know the names of letters and numbers out of order, and count to 10.



5 Amazing facts on mathematics-


"0" - zero is the only number which is known as so many names including NOUGHT, NAUGHT, NIL, ZILCH and ZIP.


