Ans 2. Indian rulers and princess were unhappy with the British because (3)

1. The East India Company made unjust laws, which made the Nawabs of India very unhappy.
2. Policy like doctrine of Lapse said that if a king died without a child then his kingdom would be taken away by the British.

3. According to their policy subsidiary alliance every ruler in India had to accept to pay a subsidy to the British for the maintenance of the British army.

Ans 5. The main features of a desert are as follows (3)
