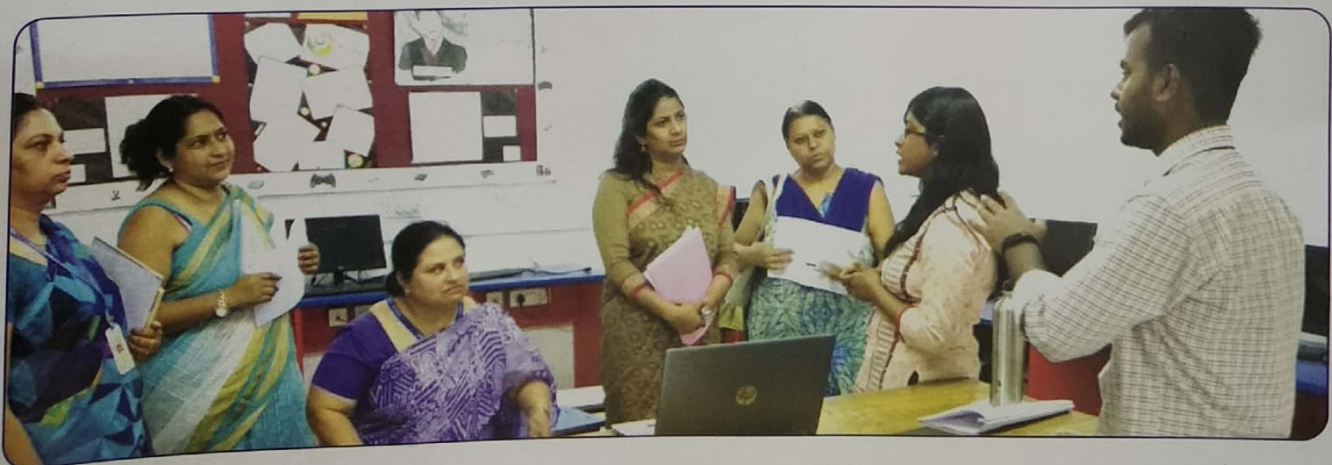

A workshop on "Storymaps" for classes VI to VIII was conducted. It was held in the association with Esri India Technologies Ltd, India's leading Geographic Information System (GIS) software and solutions provider. Story Maps is the new buzzword! Teachers love them, and students grasp them immediately. Story Maps let school educators introduce students to the concepts and techniques involved with creating a dynamic, geocentric web application. Students find story maps an interesting way to understand and learn difficult topics. These workshops act as platform for familiarizing students & teachers alike with ArcGIS Online and help them prepare dynamic, geocentric web application through story maps. Deep Public School being keen about overall development of students, became the part of this program. The students in all the workshops were excited to use story maps for communicating their ideas with the interactive web-maps and prepared different types of story maps for their projects & produced innovative, professional-looking dynamic stories on areas like National Parks, India's Animals on verge of Extinction etc. Realizing the importance of storymaps, a separate workshop for teachers was conducted. The teachers were delighted to learn about the benefits of including Geographical Information System (GIS) not only in their geography curriculum, but also in history, environmental studies, and more, with an extra dose of creativity. School is now planning to make GIS workshops a regular activity for its students and is also organising a Storymap contest with the support of Esri India.



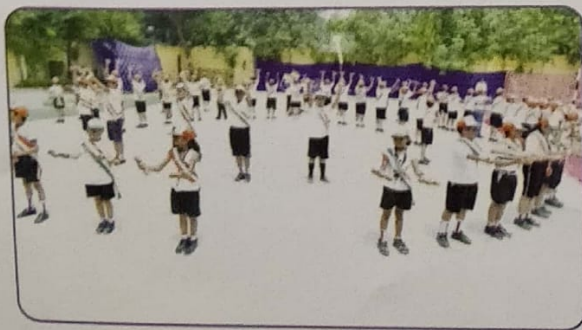
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CELEBRATIONS

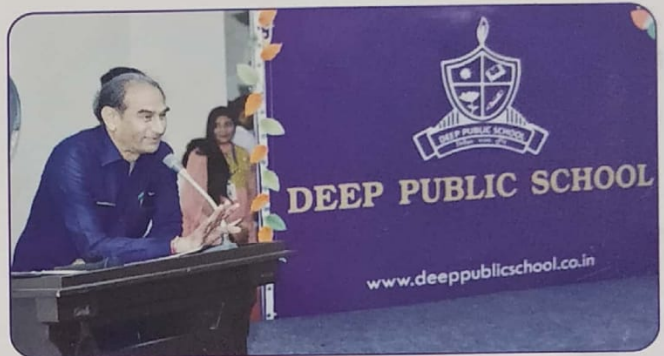

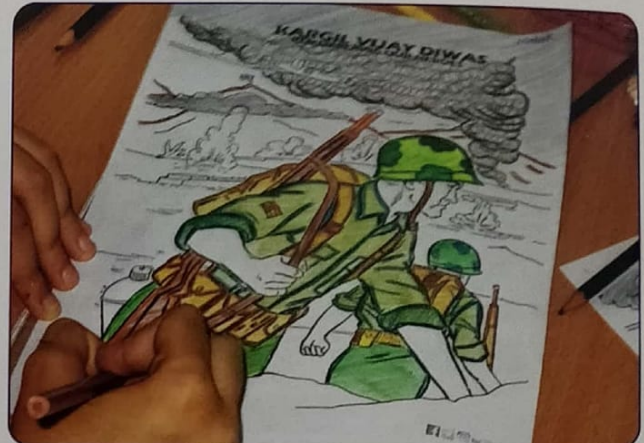
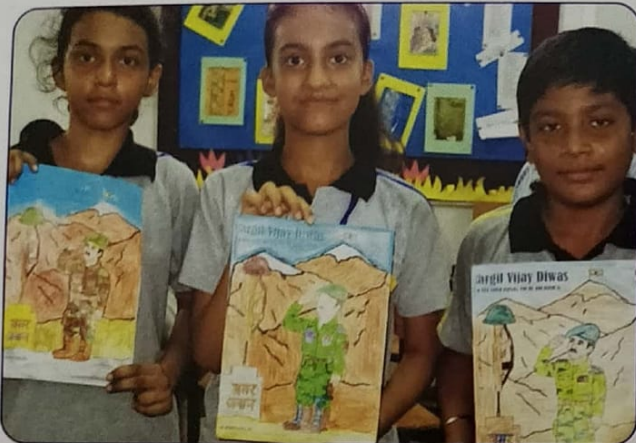
TEACHER'S DAY CELEBRATIONS

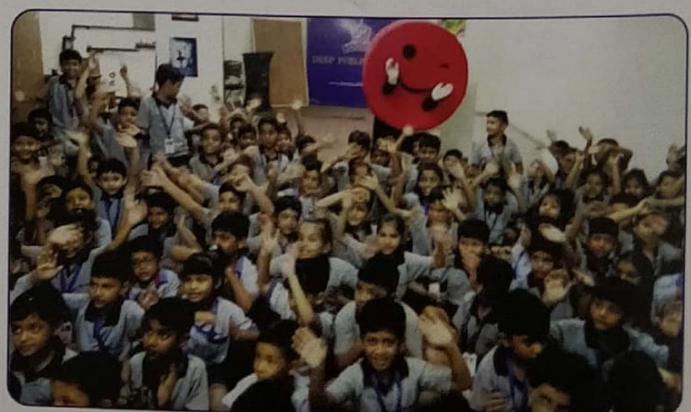
DEEP Public School SALUTES KARGIL HEROES

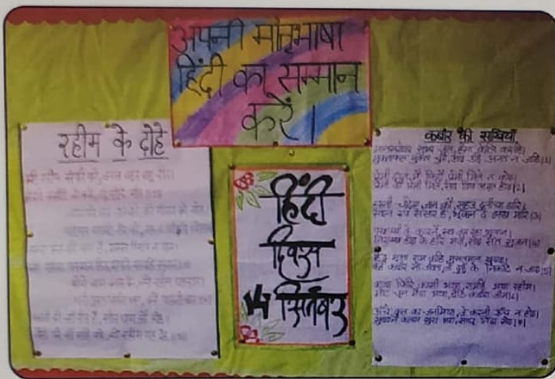
WINKIES Workshop

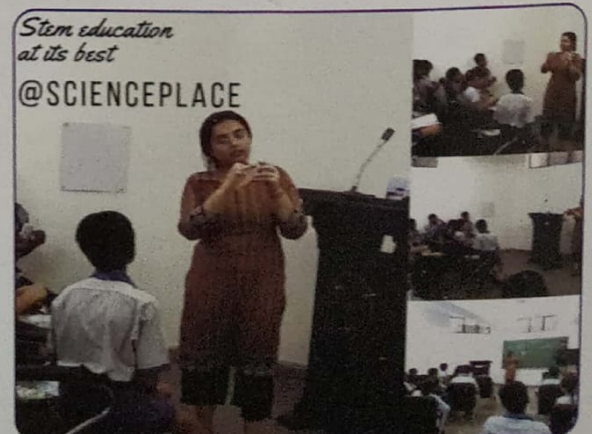
PERSONAL HYGIENE PROGRAMME

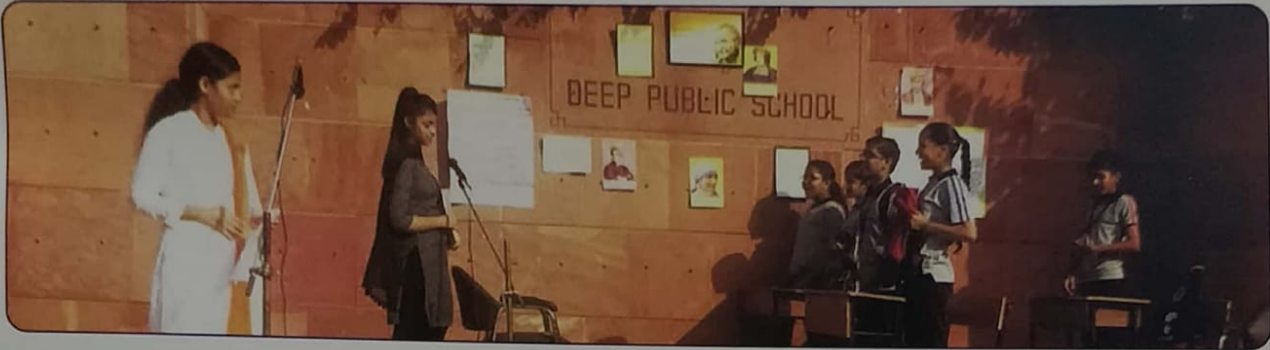
