#### PRE-PRIMARY

#### **ACITIVITY BASED**

The best way to teach kids a new thing is to make them do it on their own and in a fun way. When learning is not a burden, it is much easier to make it happen. Activity-based learning is the main focus and an essential part of our curriculum at St. Xavier's High School, Sector 81, during the foundational years of our children.





The knowledge that they will absorb during this time is going to be with them forever in their subconscious mind and will continue to guide them. Pre-Nursery kids did many activities related to their curriculum like making letters with play dough, playing matching and colour game to strengthen their knowledge of shapes and colours, and learning quantification by keeping objects on different numbers. They also did an interesting floor activity for segregation of different modes of transport.



Nursery kids had a fun learning month filled with activities like vegetable printing, crayoning in letters, bowling game, with quantification clay formations, and rocket of shapes to name a few. These activities helped in enhancing their knowledge of different letters, numbers, shapes, and colours.

They also made different crafts related to their EVS themes, like a paper boat, traffic light, and a Tricolour kite.



The Kindergarteners also had their hands full with many interesting activities. They did Suji tracing, stamping activity, making vyanjans with play dough, and making crafts like "J se Jahaz" related to their vyanjans. They did interesting experiments on 3 forms of water and float and sink activity in their EVS class. They also made a water cycle craft reflecting understanding of the concept. Created beautiful craft pieces related to sight words, shapes like cube and cuboid, Rakhi craft, Janmashtami craft, and a name train. The fun-filled rollercoaster continues for our little Xaverians, helping them to move ahead in their journey of learning new things every day.






The classes are brimming with excitement, curiosity, inquisitiveness and fun along with the knowledge gained by the students.






# CELEBRATION OF SPECIAL DAYS


Eid-Al-Adha was celebrated with great fervour and enthusiasm by Xaverians on July 20, 2021. A special assembly was conducted to

#### **RAKSHA BANDHAN**


The paths may change as life goes along, but the bond between a brother and sister remains ever strong.'

With an aim to unfold the opportunities for Xaverians to showcase and hone their talent, various club activities are conducted through out the year.






