

GLIMPSES OF SPECTACULAR

PRE-PRIMARY

ACITIVITY BASED LEARNING

Activity based learning is a teaching and learning process where information is given to the students and they decide how to process it and take the learning aspect in their own hands. Thus, activity-based learning ensures that the information is processed, used, and retained rather than just heard or memorized. Activity based learning is the main focus at St. Xavier's High School. thus. providing a creative and fun filled environment that helps students to analyze and evaluate the concepts.



The curriculum is a compilation of structured activities to provide an ease to understand the concepts right from Pre-Nursery. Activities like letter matching with paper cups, number train, quantification by play dough balls not only help to foster their

fine motor skills but also help them to enhance their thinking and reasoning. Listening the concepts of EVS, they make mental note of observations from their listening experience and express the same through craft like Day/Night concept, table manners, story crafts etc. At St. Xavier's high school, hands on experience is given to the children through the activities like shoe polishing for introducing cobbler, making fruit salad to understand the concept healthy eating better.



We at St. Xavier's believe that developmental aims are the targets to be achieved over a period of preschool years through interesting variations and in tandem with an individual's pace. Children learn most things through exploration, observation and experience therefore, activities in nursery are designed to enhance their cognitive development including writing

skills. Activities like Semolina Tracing, Clay Formations, Slate **Practice** are done on a daily basis to make the children understand the formation of letters and numbers in a fun way. To enhance vocabulary, free hand the drawings of the objects related to the letters is practiced. Considering creative the and logical development, activities like live experiments for introduction of understanding colours. the of properties water: seed germination are planned in the curriculum. Dramatic play, role play activities are conducted to identify the emotions of self and others.



Little Xaverians in Kindergarten get the opportunity to effectively engage themselves in the activities like free hand drawing of the things which they have observed and experienced with revised ideas. Conceptual learning is also fostered with the opportunities to express themselves through role play activities, object talk etc. Number readiness activities like rocket making for reverse counting, house for hundred are also done to elate the curious minds of our juniors. Other interesting activities done for their holistic development are formation of vyanjans with play dough and semolina.

Thus, including such activity based learning provides a proper connect with the students with a better chance of grasping the concepts and retaining important information. This helps us to create a fun and interesting environment which leads to a positive

succession in our little Xaverians throughout the year.




They also went on a virtual tour of "The Golden Temple at Amritsar" and saw how this auspicious day is celebrated on a large scale at the Gurudwara.

national days and festivals are celebrated in school through special assemblies.




ENRICHING LEARNING THROUGH VIRTUAL FIELD TRIPS

explored the world of animals. This adventure-laden trip was not only an enthralling experience for the kids, but also informative and enriched them with knowledge, curiosity and learning.









The assembly reached to its end with Guru Nanak Dev Ji's message of oneness and compassion for all.


BLACK CATS AND WITCHES BREW, THIS HALLOWEEN CELEBRATION IS FOR YOU.

deep within and enlightens us of what we are capable of.






Xaverians are fortunate enough to get opportunities to hone these much-required skills.
