INCULCATING READING HABITS WORKSHOP CONDUCTED BY MS. NIKITA DUTTA GUPTA

Invite authors to speak: Students after reading the book of their choice will be asked to talk about the read book as an author.

Aap Ki Adalat: Group of students will be given same book to read and on the basis of it a child from hat group turn wise will be asked several questions related to the book read by the group.

Movies on books: students will be asked to make a list of books on which movies are made and then they will be asked to watch the movie and then read the book to find out how much different is the movie from the book.

Identify a book by its cover: Students should be asked to choose the book by looking at it's cover.

The workshop empowered the teachers with techniques to gradually inculcate reading habits amongst children and help reading become a support system in attaining academic excellence and grooming them into thoughtful, responsible, well informed and most importantly well read individuals.
