ITL Public School in collaboration with National Geographic conducted a workshop on the launch of Chandrayaan 2. The workshop was held for the students of Classes VI – XI, on Monday, 2nd September 2019, in the school auditorium.

The young ITLeens were engaged in an informative and interactive session where the resource person, who was the activity coordinator of the organisation, provided all the information on the topic. He shared the incredible story of India’s bold attempt to reach the moon’s South Pole through the Chandrayaan 2. A short video was shown to enlighten the students about the launch of Chandrayaan 1 and its history. During the workshop, the following points were highlighted upon – the how and why of Chandrayaan 2, the science behind it and what makes it different from the previous missions. Students were explained about the orbiter, the Vikram Lander and the rover.

A questionnaire session was held where students asked their queries about its landing on 7th September 2019. The difference between **PSLV**(Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle) and **GSLV**(Geosynchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle) was also discussed. It was an eye opener for the young ITLeens as they gathered some important information about the functions of **ISRO** (Indian Space Research Organisation) and **SSERD** (Study for Space Education and Research Development).

The workshop was a great platform for the students to accumulate enough knowledge about Chandrayaan 2, which is India’s second planned mission to the moon in an attempt to expand the boundaries of human knowledge.
