"On World Hepatitis Day, Let Us Motivate and Inspire People to Keep Up Their Fight Against Hepatitis"

World Hepatitis Day is observed every year on 28 July to raise awareness of viral hepatitis, an inflammation of the liver that causes severe liver disease and hepatocellular cancer.

ITL PUBLIC SCHOOL observed World Hepatitis Day to increase awareness and understanding of viral hepatitis as a global priority. This year's theme "Hepatitis Can't Wait", conveyed the urgency of efforts needed to eliminate hepatitis as a public health threat by 2030. With a person dying every 30 seconds from hepatitis related illness – even in the current COVID-19 crisis – we couldn't wait to act on viral hepatitis.

This aligned with UN Sustainable Development Goal- 3, to promote health and wellbeing, and target 3.3: "End the epidemics of AIDS, tuberculosis, malaria, and neglected tropical diseases and combat hepatitis, waterborne and other communicable diseases".

The ITLeens of grades VI-XII participated in Poster Making Activity to create awareness about this dreadful disease and info graphics were sent across though their official WhatsApp group. This brought the children together under a single theme to raise awareness of the global burden of viral hepatitis and to influence real change.
