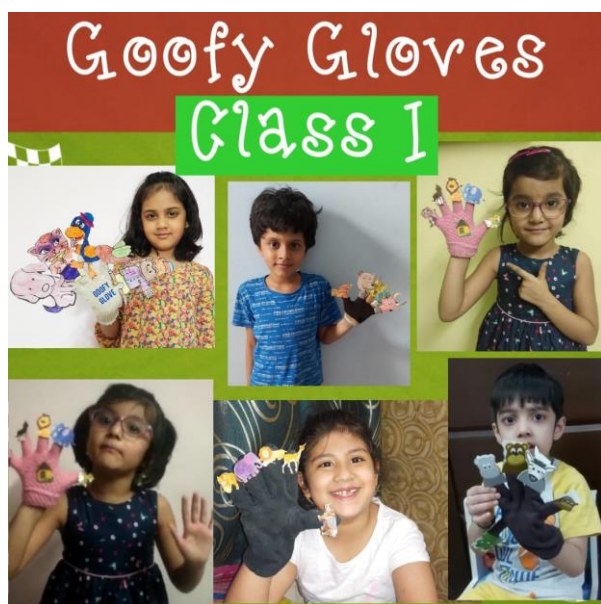
It is absolutely important for children to learn various skills along with academics. Life skills go hand in hand with development and can help the child succeed in various aspects of life.

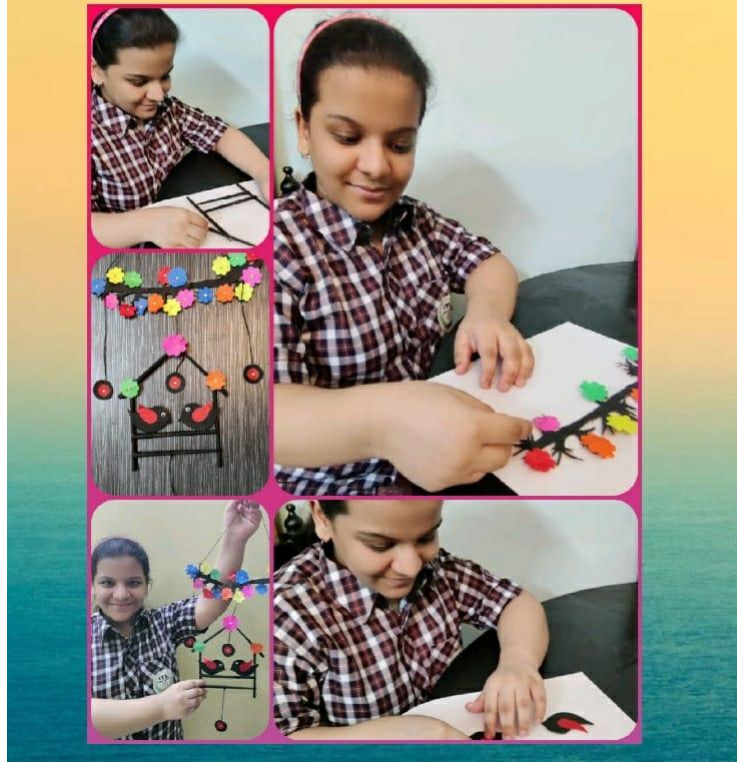

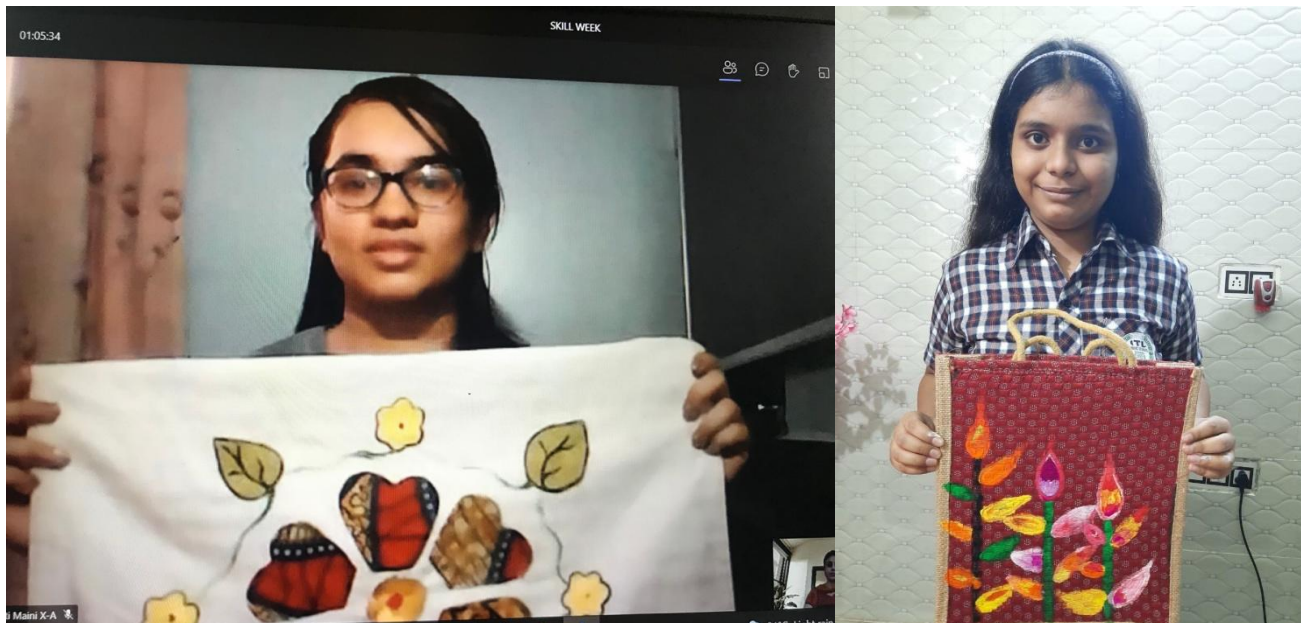

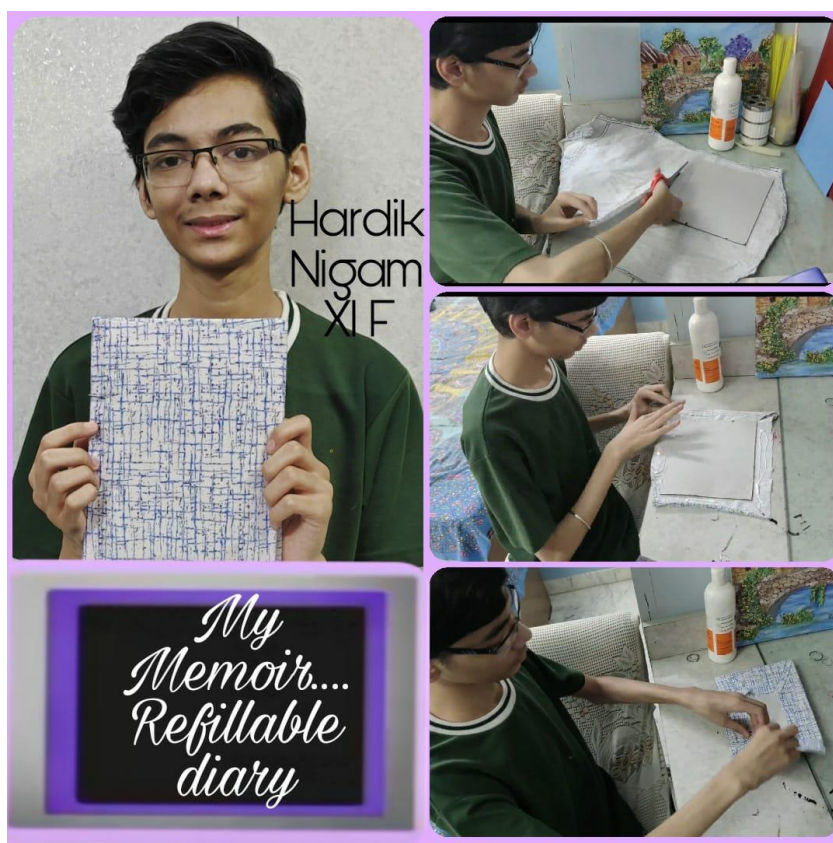
