

Mega Cleanliness Drive (1st Aug-15th Aug 21)

ITL Public School observed Mega Cleanliness drive from 1st August to 15th August'21 during which plethora of activities were organized in Classes I-V to sensitize the young ITLeens towards the importance of cleanliness in avoiding diseases, maintaining a healthy lifestyle and keeping the surroundings **Green and Clean**. Students were able to realize that cleanliness is everybody's responsibility and one should keep themselves and their surroundings clean and hygienic. It also brings good and positive thoughts in the mind which slows down the occurrence of diseases.

Children of **Class-I** participated in the activity, **Clean Hands Sensory Bag** through which they learnt the importance of maintaining hand hygiene to keep germs away. Steps of washing hands were demonstrated to the children by the teachers through which diseases can be kept at bay.



The students of **Class II** participated in **Waste Wise Innovative Toys** in which they used recyclable house hold items like cloth clippers, card board boxes, tissue rolls, bottle caps, skewers etc. to create innovative DIY toys under the guidance of teacher during the online session.



Children of **Class-III** created **Backyard Ecosphere** collecting some rocks, pebbles, twigs, mosses, soil substrate, plants etc. from their surroundings and arranged them in a transparent mason jar along with water during the online session. They realized that an ecosphere needs to be nurtured for peaceful coexistence of all living beings.



The students of Class IV participated in the activity **Reuse and Recycle Trash to Rethink** through an interesting workshop conducted by Ms. Anchal Sardana (one of parents) in which she demonstrated how to turn plastic and glass bottles to attractive planters. The children practically recycled and reused plastic trash to recreate useful items for their homes in an online session.



The students of Class-V reflected upon **My Clean & Green Mission** during which they were shown a short documentary on **'Gandagi Mukh Bharat'** during the online session after which they penned down their thoughts/suggestions in a creative manner. Students suggested ways through which we can make our country a better place to live in.





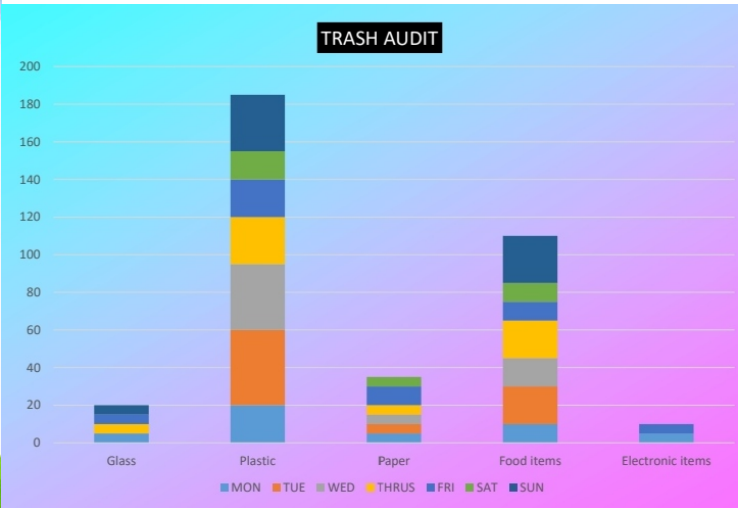
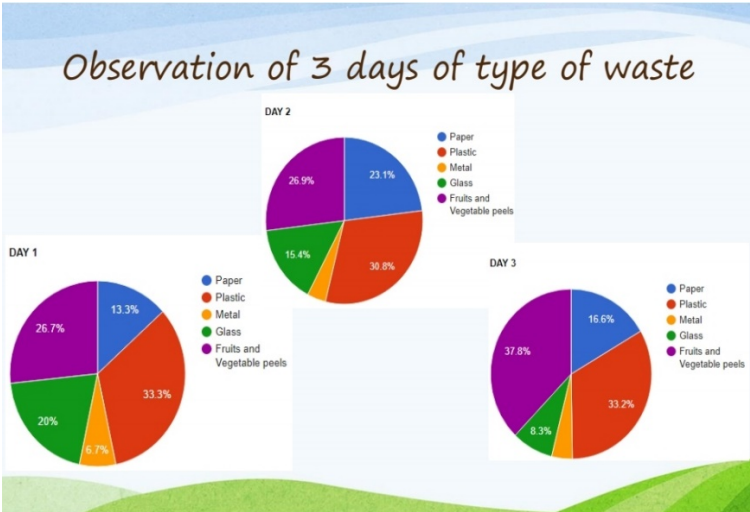
These activities generated a lot of enthusiasm, creativity, reflection in our young children and everyone was enriched while doing them.

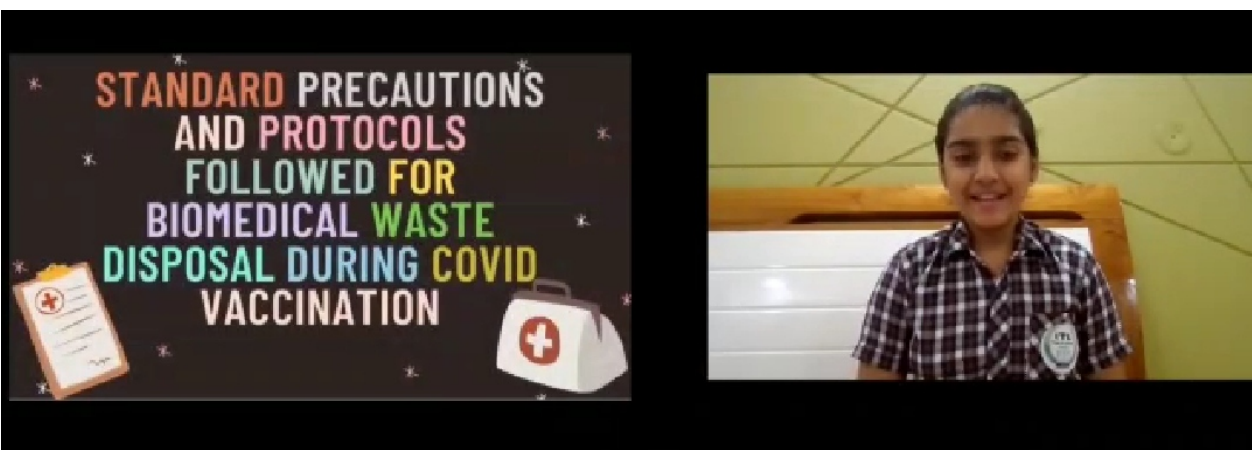
