

The theme for this year is Equality-Reducing Inequalities, Advancing Human Rights, which finds its roots in the Article 1 of the UDHR (Universal Declaration of Human Rights) – "All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights."

In line with the Sustainable Development Goals of the United Nation, the magazine also contained articles on other aspects of Human Rights like Peace (SDG 16), Hunger (SDG 2), Economic Growth (SDG 8), and Climate Action (SDG 13). In an endeavour to inspire young minds for a sustainable world, various activities like Slogan Writing, Puppet Show, Comic Strip Making were organized to make the students aware of their rights and help them understand why it is important to stand up for them.

Furthermore, the students also made a video highlighting the history of the Human Rights and how the children are at the centre of these rights, focusing upon their health and development, and their participation in the matters concerning them. The magazine and the video turned out to be quite enlightening.

On this day in 1948, the United Nation's General Assembly adopted the Universal Declaration of Human Rights Day. The day is celebrated to improve the physical, social, cultural and spiritual wellbeing and welfare of the vulnerable group of people globally.



MAHATMA GANDHI ONCE SAID-

The Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, 2012 came into force with effect from 14 November 2012, along with the Rules framed thereunder. The POCSO Act, 2012 is a comprehensive law to provide for the protection of children from the offenses of sexual assault, sexual harassment, and pornography while safeguarding the interests of the child at every stage of the judicial process by incorporating child-friendly mechanisms for reporting, recording of evidence, investigation and speedy trial of offenses through designated special courts.
