As part of Skill Development, students of **Classes XI and XII** got the opportunity to attend an educative workshop on **4 August, 2022** whereby they learnt the art of **SHIBORI**, a Japanese manual tie-dyeing technique, which produces a number of different patterns on fabric. **Ms Seema Chaudhary, Associate Professor, UID, Ahmedabad** was the Resource person for the workshop.

The workshop was organized in sync with the vision shared by **NEP 2020 and Education 4.0 reforms**, to underscore competency-based education that promotes experiential, holistic, inquiry-driven learning and an entrepreneurial mind-set

The students were introduced to the concept of Shibori with an interesting and well-informed PPT. The Resource Person elaborately explained the Japanese culture and the different methods of creating natural dyes by using colours like tea leaves, indigo, pomegranate etc. Students learnt the steps of creating Shibori and got an enriching **Hands-on Experience**, they learnt different ties like pole tie, rope tie, bundle tie etc. required in Shibori The Resource Person emphasized how the SHIBORI art helps in enhancing geometric

understanding and made students realize the significance of handmade dye industry which advocates sustainability and is in accordance to the **SDG Goals**

The workshop was indeed a great learning experience and students were enthralled to be skilled and empowered with the art of **Shibori**.
