To bring about real change it is imperative that we purge our minds of all prejudices and biases and genuinely treat all human beings with dignity and intrinsic value.</p> <p>Latest estimates by the <u>International Labour Organisation</u> (ILO) show that forced labour and forced marriage have increased significantly in the last five years. 10 million more people were in modern slavery in 2021. Although modern slavery is not defined in law, it is used as an umbrella term covering practices such as forced labour, debt bondage, forced marriage, and human trafficking.
