





<u>Classification</u>: Types of plant e.g. shrubs, herbs, creepers




LANGUAGE SKILL:

Trees are big, and trees are small, Some are short and some are tall. They give us shelter, they give us food, Don't think of them as firewood.


If they could talk, they would say, We harm no one please stay away. So let us try and save the trees, I feel they cry for life, but we can't see.











Value Education - Caring towards Nature

For Parents

 Parents to reinforce pre-number concepts (e.g- big/small, far / near, in/out, empty/full) in daily conversation.

 Please discuss the significance of festivals like Independence Day, Janmashtami and Rakshabandhan with your child. • Show her pictures, videos or in reality the National Emblem, National Bird, National Animal and National Flower.
