I will initiate the quest for cleanliness with myself, my family, my locality, my village and my work place.


I believe that the countries of the world that appear clean are so because their citizens don't indulge in littering nor do they allow it to happen.


With this firm bellef, I will propagate the message of Swachh Bharat Mission in villages and towns.


