### INTRA-SCHOOL ACTIVITIES





**Class III** students imprinted their hands using colours of the Indian National Flag on a sheet of paper and wrote a peace message on it.






## We laugh, We cry, We make time fly, Best friends are we, my sister and me!!

Dr. Rina Sehgal, a leading psychologist with 19 years of experience in school counselling and recipient of Fulbright Distinguished Counsellor Award from USA, conducted a workshop for class V students on understanding their body hygiene and safety. She brought about the concept of Good Touch and Bad Touch through an interaction with them. Teachers were also imparted training to carry this learning forward. Students were open and participative. After the first workshop while the boys had a cricket match planned for them, the girls participated in 'Onset of puberty' workshop. Dr. Rima, school Doctor and Principal also cleared a lot of myths about the changes that take place at the time of puberty.
