COMMON NOUNS

A name that is common to all persons, places, animals or things of the same kind is called a

common noun.

PROPER NOUNS.

A specific name given to a person, place, animal or thing is called a proper noun.

e.g. Sheetal, Rajasthan, China, DPSG

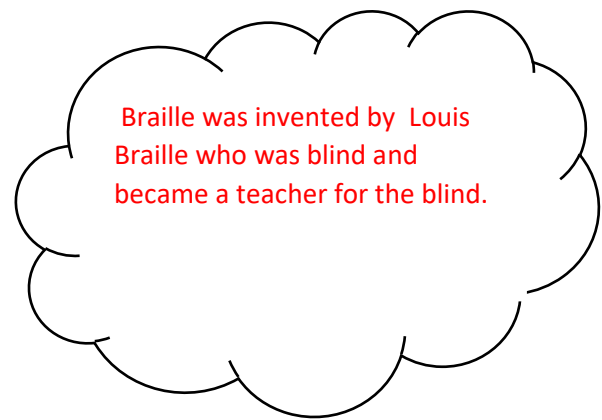

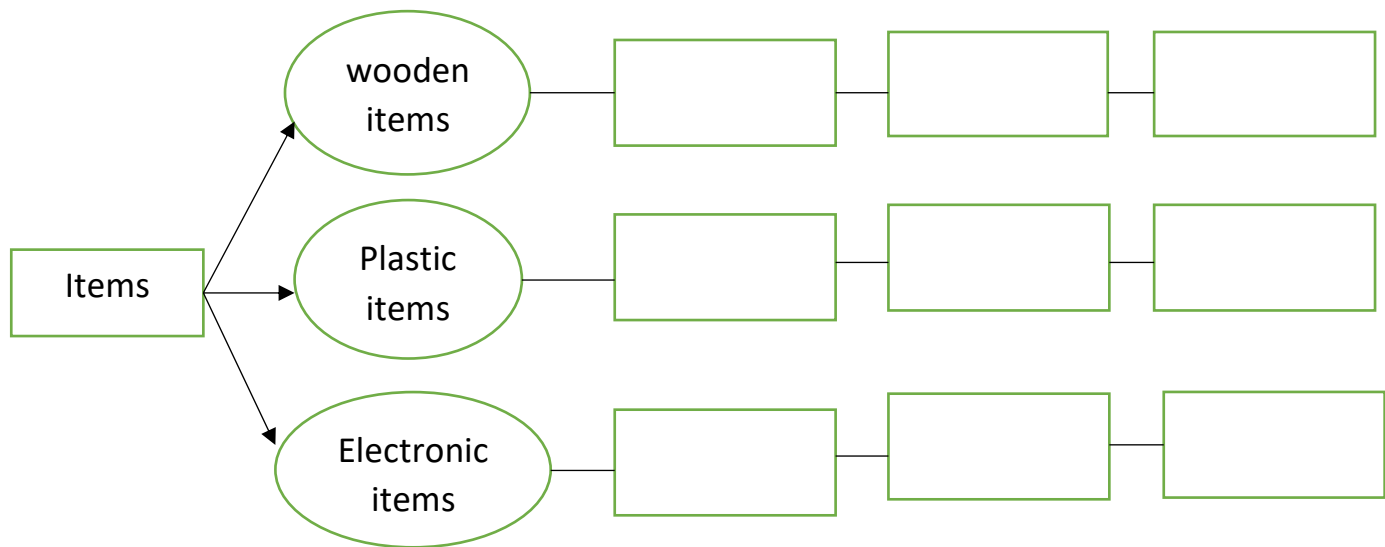
