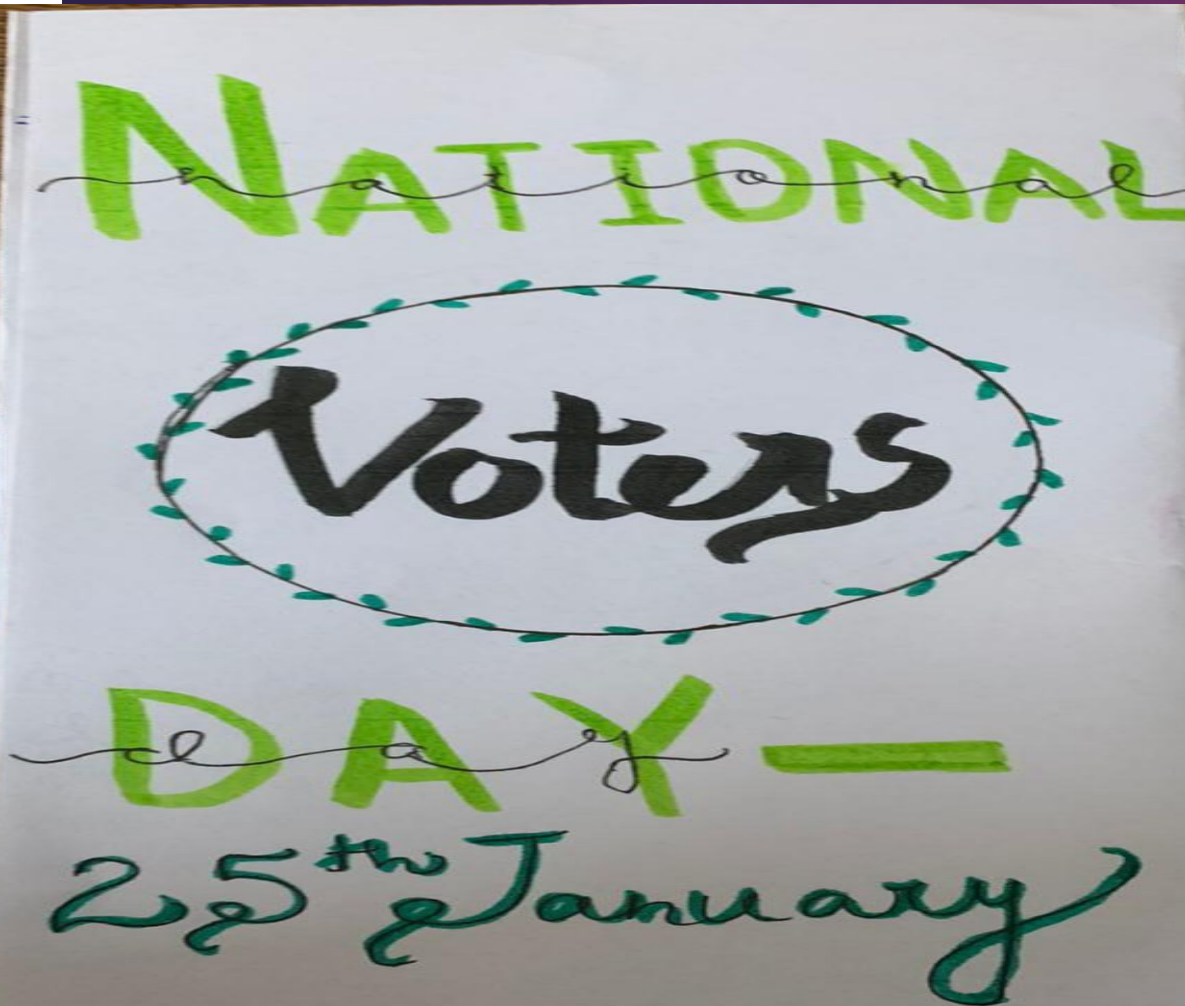

* National Voters Day

→ In order to encourage more young voters to take part in political process, Government of India has decided to celebrate January 25 every years as "National voters day".

It has been started from 25th Jan 2011 to mark commission's foundation day.

"In order to effectively deal with this problem, the Election Commission has decided to take up a vigorous exercise to identify all eligible voters attaining the age of 18 years as of Jan 1 every year in each of 85000 Polling Stations across the country."

NATIONAL VOTER'S DAY PLEDGE

Making Elections Inclusive, Accessible and Participative

The Election Commission of India operates on the principle of "No Voter to be left behind" and is committed to including all kinds of voters in the electoral process in order to attain the Constitutional and Legislative mandate of Universal Adult Suffrage. The main aim of voter education is to provide all the requisite information for effective and efficient electoral participation by all constituents to achieve the desired objectives of Universal Adult Suffrage. While many categories of voters are covered under general or formal voter education programs, there are special groups which need strategically well designed and a focused outreach and special campaigns to receive voter information, facilitation and motivation to participate.

Youth, Women, Historically Marginalised Groups, Minorities and Indigenous Peoples' inclusion and participation in election processes are critical tools for strengthening democratic processes. The ECI's persistent and systematic voter education and electoral participation strategy has changed with each election and the application of novel practices has led in the significant increase in voter turnout, particularly among women and youth. Short Films can be made on electoral literacy for persons with disabilities. It is found that some young people who had recently reached the voting age of 18 are showing little or no interest in enrolling on the electoral roll. The goal of "National Voter's Day" is to encourage young people to participate in the democratic process. The day was developed to remind young people that it is their turn to be active participants in the election process and to get eligible voters to exercise their Fundamental Right.
