The G20, or Group of Twenty, is an intergovernmental forum of the world's major developed and developing economies. These include India, Australia, Argentina, Brazil, Canada, China, France, Germany, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Republic of Korea, Mexico, Russia, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, Turkey, UK, the US and the European Union.

India will assume the G20 Presidency from the 1st of December this year from Indonesia and will convene the G20 Leaders' Summit for the first time in the country in 2023. A nation deeply committed to democracy and multilateralism, India's G20 Presidency would be a watershed moment in her history as it seeks to play an important role by finding pragmatic global solutions for the wellbeing of all, and in doing so, manifest the true spirit of 'Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam' or the 'World is One Family'.

A similar initiative is taken up by UN which is celebrating 2023 as the International Year of Millets. Commemorations such as these draw attention to lesser-known crops. They also foster a global exchange of ideas, research and development as well as bolster trade.

While account penetration is nearly universal in high-income economies, with 94 percent of adults reporting that they have an account at a formal financial institution, it is only 54 percent in developing economies.




Fig 1. Emissions per capita trajectories developed in 2015 and 2021 for the G20 countries 2015 projections - Orange, 2021 projections - Blue

- iii. Research on the possible reasons for the results above and comment on the same, for each country.
- 2. Discuss the different components of emissions. Research on the different methods of emission intensity reduction targets. (% of different components)
