

The Air Force School (TAFS) was established in temporary wartime hutments at Wellingdon Camp, Club Road, New Delhi on 18th July 1955 with the aim of providing comprehensive modern education to children of personnel of the Indian Air Force. In May 1967, the school shifted to its present Aravali Campus at Subroto Park, New Delhi. The school celebrated its Silver Jubilee in 1980 when the word "Central" was dropped from its name. The school celebrated its Golden Jubilee in the year 2005.

The School is situated on the Aravali ridge - amidst picturesque surroundings - lined by rows of majestic Eucalyptus and Ashoka trees. In the 15 acre area of the school, there are numerous varieties of Bougainvillea, ranging from the common Magenta to the rare lovely Mary Palmer which blossom throughout the year.

Although the school was established primarily for the benefit of children belonging to the IAF personnel, it has always been open towards of Army and Navy personnel as well as to Civilians. Thereby it satisfies a long felt need of the Air Force personnel and simultaneously provides quality education to a much wider spectrum of children, from all over the country.

The Air Force School is a co-educational public school with boarding facilities for boys of classes VI to XII.

The school is affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education and is a member of the Indian Public School Conference (IPSC) and the National Progressive Schools Conference (NPSC). The school has been declared ISO certified in the year 2007.

School Rules

- Attend school regularly. Frequent absenting from school for small reasons will not be allowed.
- Reach school in time. The reporting time is 7:50am. Be present for the assembly at 7:55am.
- Entry into school will not be allowed after 8:15 am.
- No child will be allowed to leave school before cease hours unless its an emergency.
- Display good behaviour at school and outside. Students are answerable to the school authorities for their conduct both within and outside the school.
- Behave in an orderly and disciplined manner in the school bus. Show concern for other students.
- Keep the school neat and clean. Use the dustbin.
- A proper water bottle is to be carried to school. Soft drink bottles or plastic bottles are not allowed in school.
- Bring a tiffin every day along with a napkin.
- Pack books, notebooks, pencil box, and other stationery items as per timetable or instructions by the teachers.
- Respect the school property. Graffiti is strictly prohibited. Report breakages to the class teacher.
- Go to the sickbay only with a teacher or ayah didi.
- While washing hands in the washroom, use soap dispensers appropriately without damaging it or wasting any soap.

- Toys of any kind
- · Gold ornaments
- Plastic bottles / polybags of any kind.
- Mobile phones.

Guidelines for Parents

Parents are equal partners in education. Without their cooperation the school can achieve little on its own. Here are a few ways in which parents can contribute:

1. Regularity and Punctuality

- Regularity and punctuality are intrinsic part of school discipline as they help to develop a healthy respect for work and study in children.
- Attendance at school is therefore compulsory except in cases of illness or special circumstances.
- Children must strictly adhere to the school timings and reach school by 7:55 am on all working days.
- Please do not pick up your ward from school before cease hours.

2. Leave of Absence

In case your ward is required to take leave, the request is to be conveyed to the Class teacher either through Parent Portal or as an email sent to the school e-mail address. The hard copy of the leave application also could be submitted at school. If the leave is on medical grounds, medical certificate should be attached with the application. Also note that WhatsApp will not be considered as an official means of communication.

3. School Diary

Ensure that your ward brings the diary to school everyday.

- ♦ Encourage him/her to note down the assignments carefully and regularly in the diary. Check the diary regularly for any entries/circulars from the school.
- ◆ The diary may also be used by the parents for communicating with the teachers.
- Read the contents of the diary carefully and sign the notes, if any, written by the teacher.

4. Home Assignments

Regular home assignments are given to students to reinforce learning at home. These also help to inculcate good study habits among students.

Parents must ensure that their ward is regular in doing these assignments neatly and on his/her own. Please encourage the child to submit it on time.

5. School Bags

We advise you to instruct your child to pack his/her school bag as per the days' timetable. Please ensure that your ward does not carry excess books/ materials and follow the teacher's instructions while packing the bag.

6. Healthy Eating Habits

All students are expected to bring proper tiffin and a water bottle. It is advisable to send healthy tiffin (green vegetables, seasonal fruits etc). Restrict intake of junk food. Pizzas, burgers, chips, french fries, salad dressings, samosas, tikkis and cookies/biscuits contain high salt content and saturated fats which harm the body.

7. Parent Teacher Meeting

Parent Teacher Meetings should be utilized as a platform to interact with the teachers to be well informed regarding the academic progress and behaviour of the child. The schedule for these meetings is mentioned in the school calendar. However, parents are also informed about the Meeting through SMS/message sent by the school.

8. School Uniform

School uniform is a discipline in itself and should be adhered to by all students.

- Please ensure that your child is wearing the correct school uniform and is neatly turned out
- Polished shoes, a neat hair-cut, trimmed nails are desirable as important.

9. Medication

Parents must inform the class teacher, in writing, regarding the details of any medicine that their child needs to take regularly or if he/she is allergic to any drug.

- ♦ Do not send your child to school in case he/she is suffering from an infectious disease like chicken pox, mumps, conjunctivitis etc. This will save others from ill health.
- ♦ Any child reporting SICK will not be allowed to attend the school under any circumstances.
- Please do not drop your child to school after a visit to the hospital/dispensary.

10. Hobbies

- Guide your child to cultivate a hobby like playing a musical instrument, drawing, painting, reading, playing a game or a sport.
- ♦ Please encourage reading habit in your child. Curtail the T.V. viewing hours of your ward. Watch informative channels like Star Sports, Discovery, National Geographic, Animal Planet, Times Now, CNN-IBN, BBC, and CNN among others, with your child.
- Watch such programmes together as a family and hold discussions on the same.

11. Responsibility

- Your ward should be instructed to be careful about his/her possessions.
- Instruct him/her to take care of his/her things.
- Kindly put a name tag on your child's belongings.
- Expensive articles should not be brought to school.

12. Manners/Behaviour

The child is a mirror of his/her home.

Respect for others, following rules and politeness of speech are first learnt at home.

• Be particular about good behaviour and a

- refined language.
- ◆ Teach your child to value money. Do not indulge your child by giving pocket money liberally.
- Criticising a teacher or the school in the company of a child is undesirable. It reduces the respect a learner should have for his teachers.
- ♦ For the benefit of your child if you notice any changes in behavior or/and academics, kindly bring it to the notice of the class teacher and the counsellor.

13. Safety on the Road

The safety of your ward in and around the school is of utmost concern to us. Parents are requested to kindly educate their wards on the safety rules and explain the repercussions of not adhering to these rules.

14. Change of Address and Contact Numbers

It is very important that you inform the class teacher and office immediately if there is a change in your address and / or telephone numbers, so that we can contact you easily in an emergency.

15. Correct Study Habits

Correct study habits need to be imparted at an early age.

- Ensure that your ward is regular in submitting his projects and assignments.
- Encourage your child to participate in cocurricular activities.

Check the school website www.tafssp.com regularly for the latest updates

- 1. Update the immunization card of your child till the age of 15 years as per WHO schedule.
- 2. At an early age make your child aware of the rules of hygiene such as washing hands, oral hygiene, bathing, covering one's mouth while sneezing, hair care, trimming nails and toilet etiquettes.
- 3. Get a dental and ophthalmic check up done once every year.
- 4. Parents should be aware of communicable (infectious or contagious) diseases in concern with public health, namely- Ebola, Swine flu, Measles, TB, Chicken pox, Conjunctivitis, Typhoid, Scabies, COVID-9, Hand, Foot and mouth (HFM) disease etc.
- In case the child shows symptoms of any one seasonal infectious diseases for e.g. swine flu,
 HFM disease, COVID-9 inform the school doctor immediately or consult your family
 physician. He/She should not be sent to school in such cases and should strictly follow the
 advice of the treating physicians. After recovery the child may be sent to school only after
 procuring a medical fitness certificate from the doctor.
- Children should know the importance of hygiene towards the control of transmission of diseases like typhoid, dysentery, diarrhea etc. Proper washing habits and trimming of nails can go a long way in prevention of these diseases.
- 5. Students suffering from any medical /paramedical health issues or under the medical supervision of a specialist doctor should inform the school doctor at the earliest with the relevant treatment details.
- 6. Parents are required to fill up the "Medical Card" in duplicate given on the next page.

1. Class UKG

- Registration will take place in December-January, for the new academic year.
- b) The minimum age for admission to UKG is 4 plus, as on 31 March, of the year of admission.
- Admission to UKG will take place as per the Government rules and recommendations formulated from time to time.

2. Class I-V

- Registration in the first week of April depending on availability of seats in each class
- Admission to be carried out on production of Transfer Certificate and Mark Sheet from the previous school.

Withdrawal

- TC Application form is available on the school website. It must be signed by both parents.
- One month's notice must be given in writing for a withdrawal. In case of a short notice period, fee for the next month will be charged.
- A student will be issued a Transfer Certificate only when the school dues have been cleared.
- I-Card & Library Card must be returned to the librarian before clearance.
- The first and last payment of school dues must be done only in cash.
- In case a student is leaving Delhi, the Transfer Certificate must be counter signed by The Education Officer, Zone XX, C-4 Vasant Vihar, New Delhi.

- Please quote your child's admission number during any kind of correspondence with the school.
- 2. School fee is to be paid quarterly. The quarter begins from 01 April, 01 July, 01 October and 01 January respectively.

The fee should be paid between the 1st and 10th of the first month of each quarter. For fee paid after 10th of the first month of each quarter, a late fee fine of Rs.10/- per day will be charged. In case of a holiday falling on 10th, the fee will be accepted on the next working day without late fee fine.

- 3. Name of student will be struck off without any intimation if the fee is not paid on the last day of the first month respective quarter. Further a re-admission fee of Rs.200/- will also be charged in addition to late fee fine in case of re-admission.
- 4. Fee slips will be made available in student fee portal on school website during first week of each quarter. Parents are to check the same on school website. In case of non-receipt of fee slips, Accounts department of the school may be approached for the same.

Kindly make the online payment of fee of your ward by 10th of Apr, Jul, Oct & Jan through fee payment link available on school website (http:// www.tafssp.com) after entering the login credential of your ward."

- 5. In case fee is paid by Cheques/drafts due to any reason Cheques/drafts must be drawn in favour of "The Air Force School, Subroto Park, New Delhi " and submitted alongwith fee slips downloaded from students portal.
- 6. If the fee paid by cheque is dishonored by the bank in any manner, the payment will be accepted along with applicable late fee fine. Further actual bank charges prevailing for

dishonored cheque will also be charged separately.

School Transport

There are two school owned buses. Additionally, the school hires private buses to help students commute. AFND also provides buses for children of Air Force personnel/residing at various Air Force stations in Delhi/NCR. In order to ensure the safety of their wards, parents are advised to use school/school hired buses/AF coaches.

- Bus routes are fixed at the beginning of the academic session. Please do not request for a change of route in the midsession.
- To avail the bus facility please fill up the prescribed application form available with the school bus in-charge/school website. Submit the same before 15 March. You will be required to submit two recent passport sized photographs of the student.
- The Bus Fee will be charged for 10 ½ months only. Once the bus facility is opted, bus fee will be charged for full academic session.
- Discontinuation of bus during mid of the academic session will not be permitted except under extreme circumstances & with prior approval of Principal. The bus fee is to be paid for entire month even if the bus has been used only for a day in a month. There is no system of one way charge.
- A Bus Pass will be issued every year. In case of loss a duplicate Pass will be issued for Rs.20/- . The student must carry the Bus Pass at all times.
- The bus facility is provided on a 'No Profit, No Loss' basis. A sufficient number of students is required to make it a feasible venture. Hence bus facilities cannot be claimed as a right by any parent.

- Students will not be permitted to board the bus or alight from it at any point other than the authorized boarding point.
- Students involved in acts of indiscipline, especially those affecting the safety and well-being of other students will be debarred from using the bus.
- Measures of all kinds will be taken for the safety of students using the school bus. However the school cannot be held responsible for any accident, injury or loss of life. In case the school/school hired buses are not used for commuting, parents must ensure that only government authorized/legal modes of transportation are used.
- For all queries related to school transport, parents are requested to contact Transport I/c, who is a single point of contact. The particulars of transport i/c are available on school website.
- Queries regarding Air Force coaches to be addressed to transport department AFND/ respective units.

Bus Rules

- Arrive at the bus stop at least 5 minutes before bus ETA (Expected Time of Arrival).
- Students must carry the bus passes every day & hand over the same to conductor in the morning.
- If a student has been picked up by parent, a written information must be given to HM and Bus I/c for accountability and to avoid any confusion.
- If a student is unable to board the bus in the afternoon due to any reason, he/she must report immediately to the main office/HM office/any school official. Parents must educate/brief children in this regard.
- Without proper bus passes, students will not be allowed to travel in the school bus.
- Carry a written application by a parent, duly verified by the class teacher in case you need

- to travel on another route for a day.
- Inform the bus driver/conductor in case you plan not to travel by the school bus on your return journey.
- Parents are not to board the school buses/hired buses at any time for any reasons, whatsoever.
- While in the bus students must Remain seated in the bus and do not extend any body part outside the window.
- Wait for the bus to come to a halt before boarding or deboarding.
- Do not eat or drink in the bus.
- Do not distract the driver's attention by shouting and other acts.

Sick Bay

The School has engaged a part-time doctor and one nurse, who are available round the clock. They provide minor medical relief, first-aid treatment and dressing for all medical problem acquired in the school.

School Counsellor

The school has a counsellor who is available for consultation and counselling during school hours.

The counsellor will address the following needs:

- Socio-emotional empowerment of children, teachers and parents by providing guidance and counselling services.
- Early identification of various behavioural, emotional, academic and psychological concerns a long with appropriate intervention.
- Resource building through training and workshops on prevalent issues for empowerment of children, teachers and parents.
- Conducting life skills training, peer mentorship and personality enhancement programmes.
- Parents could meet the school counsellor on appointment.

Special Educator

The school has a Special educator whose prime focus is on scaffolding activities and differentiating instruction to meet the needs of all students, not just the children with special needs. Direct support is provided to students in a classroom through presentations to create awareness among the students and ensuring learning through a variety of co-teaching methods and strategies.

Our inclusive classrooms include peer tutoring, cooperative learning, curricular modification and adaptation, and applied behavior analysis.

We at TAFS believe that successful inclusive education happens primarily through accepting, understanding, and attending to student differences and diversity.

Library Rules and Procedures

- 1. One library card is issued per student from classes III-V. A new book will not be issued till the card held by the student is returned.
- 2. Books must be returned on the last date stamped on the label.
- 3. Students are responsible for the books issued in their name. Books lost or damaged have to be paid for.
- 4. Silence must be maintained in the library.
- 5. The library cards are non-transferable.
- 6. Personal books cannot be brought to the library.

A variety of books are available in the school library on different subjects, the latest fiction, classics and encyclopedias.

School Book Store

The prescribed set of books for the academic session 2023-24 will be available in the school Book Shop. Other stationery items such as notebooks, files, folders, maps etc are also available. Students must buy the stationery from

the shop, as it bears the school name. This is mandatory because it ensures uniformity. Students will not be allowed to leave their classes to make purchases. Parents are requested to buy books for their wards to ensure that they do not miss their classes.

School Uniform Store

The School uniform is to be bought from the school uniform store only. The uniform purchased from the school store conforms to the standards set by the school. All articles of the uniform are to be bought well in advance. Students will not be allowed to leave their classes to buy their uniform.

Security

- All parents/visitors are to adhere to the security norms of the school.
- Visitors' passes are to be taken from school gate after making due entries in the visitors' register whenever coming to school during school hours and same are to be deposited back at the gate, at the time of leaving.
- Parents / guardians / escorts and drivers who come to drop and pick up their children from school, must carry the Escort / Guardian I- Card issued by the school.
- I-Card is to be carried at all times whenever visiting the school for any purpose such as PTA, functions, etc.
- In case this I-Card goes missing, a duplicate will only be issued after submission of a copy of duly filed FIR.
- No child will be allowed to leave school premises with any individual who is not carrying Escort/Guardian I-Card

School Uniform Essentials

The School Uniform may be obtained from the school uniform store. Any variation in the style of the skirt, trousers etc. will not be permitted. The material and colour must conform to the uniform sold in the school store. The shoes must be plain black laced shoes. The school logo cannot be duplicated or altered in any way. The student is expected to wear his/her uniform well. The turnout must be neat and smart.


