Brief description of the learning objectives, content of the activity	<p><u>Learning Objectives-</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Cognitive- Learners will be able to identify the varied forms of child labour across the world and the reasons for the same. • Socio-emotional- The learners will be able to create mass awareness about ways by which children can be kept away from workplace and ensured basic minimum necessities, including education and good health. • Behavioral learning objectives- Learners will be able to encourage others to reach out to these vulnerable children whose needs are stuck in a cycle of intergenerational poverty and are forced to work in hazardous conditions. Learners will engage in sustainable practices in consumption and production. <p>➤ <u>Brief description of the activity-</u> An awareness poster and video were shared with the students to orient them about the need to end child labour in all its forms. The menace of children being employed in any sort of work deprives them of their right to education and puts their health at risk- physically, mentally and emotionally. Children belong to schools and not workplaces! As individuals, students were oriented to shun products that involve child labour, be it fireworks or make up products.</p> <p>Children comprise the most vulnerable section of our society and need to be nurtured with care and compassion. They have certain inalienable rights and the right to live their life free from want or fear, is one of them. Poverty and prevalence of child labour are inextricably linked- resulting in 1 out of every 10 child involved in hazardous activities, globally.</p> <p>Governments cite hundreds of problems in eliminating child labour, but we should not forget that there are millions of solutions possible if the individuals, local community, civil society and other stakeholders join hands. Access to inclusive and equitable quality education for all can be instrumental in eradicating this inhuman practice. This World day against Child Labour, students pledged to speak up and take action to protect the exploited.</p>
