Description of the activity	<p><i>“The world must come together to confront climate change.”</i></p> <p>ITL Public School organized a vibrant assembly on the topic of climate change, one of the most pressing global matters of the 21st century. The event began with a presentation by junior ITLeens who dressed up as various millets and accentuated upon the benefits of millets on our health and on climate. Millet Kitchen was also set up outside the auditorium where the students presented various delectable food items made by them. The Chief Guests for the day, Mr. Sumant Shekhar, Mrs. Sanchita Deb Roy, and Mr. Prem Sharma were amazed at the fine culinary skills.</p> <p>The programme began with an invocation song titled ‘Only One Earth’, aimed to spread awareness regarding climate action and the ill-effects of climate change, and also to connect to nature as a ‘mother’. This was followed by the news bulletin of the day. To emphasise upon the significance of the role that each individual can play to bring about a positive change in the environment, Garvit of class IX narrated the motivating story of Licypriya Kangujam, a young Indian climate activist, who, along with her family and friends has been urging the government to formulate policies on climate action. Furthermore, students presented an enthralling dance performance, which aimed to encourage people to use more millet-based food, and to prevent any climate-damaging activity at their own level. To take action on any issue, one must know the problem well enough. Keeping this in mind, Vanshika Gupta, class XII and Saachi Verma, class X explained the intricacies of climate change. Pursuing the issue further, Mehul, class XII talked about how ‘Skill Bazaar’, an initiative by the school, is helping students understand the concepts of sustainable actions. He also made a point on future sustainability.</p> <p>Later, Mrs. Sanchita Roy showed a video to explain the students about carbon emissions and the carbon cycle, and how humans are disrupting it. This was followed by an interactive session by Mr. Sumant Shekhar primarily focusing on waste management. He emphasized on the concept of ‘circular economy’, and on the vision of a ‘Litter-free India’. With a good sense of humor and wit, he</p>
