LOHRI CELEBRATION

Lohri is a popular winter folk festival that marks the end of the winter season and the onset of longer days as the sun starts its journey towards the northern hemisphere. The festival is deeply rooted in agricultural traditions and is associated with the winter solstice, often linked to the harvesting of the Rabi crops like wheat, mustard and sugarcane.



The customs and rituals associated with Lohri, such as lighting bonfires, performing traditional folk dances like the Bhangra and Giddha, and sharing special foods defines the spirit of sharing and prosperity among people.

Lohri is celebrated in different names with variations in different states like Pongal in Tamil Nadu, Bhogi in Andhra Pradesh and Magh Bihu in Assam.
